

Big Picture - 2017-2018 Pop Change

- US - 327.2 million, + 2.02 million or .6%
- Colorado - 5,695,564
- Ranked 7th fastest 1.4% - NV, ID, UT, AZ, FL, WA
- 8th in total growth **79,662** - TX, FL, CA, AZ, NC, WA, GA
- Growth of 666,200 since 2010 and Ave. Annual Growth rate of 1.6% or 83,000/yr
- Garfield County since 2010 has grown by 3,000 or 0.7% annually; Glenwood Springs +400 (0.6%/yr)




Components of Population Change 1970-2018




Colorado Births and Deaths

Colorado: Total Population Change 2010 - 2017








Garfield County Population, 1990 to 2017

Garfield County Components of Natural Increase








Migration locations






Glenwood Springs Jobs, 2001 to 2017



2017 Base Industries (without Indirect)



Garfield County 2017 Employment by Industry & Wage






Glenwood Springs Employment by Industry

Garfield County 2017 Annual Employment Change by Industry & Wage





- Representation, Funding (\$1,500 per person per year in federal funding), and Information.
- Find out if your residents have any concerns and develop ways to address the concerns.
- Think about ways to let your residents know about its importance and value to your community.
 - Complete Count Committee - group of community leaders working to help everyone get counted.
 - The CCC can share questions, concerns and best practices



Why is the Census 2020 important to Colorado and its Communities?

\$400 billion in federal funding allocated nationally based on Census population counts






We are Aging Fast

- Currently very few people over the age 65.
 - 6th lowest share of all states in US (14%) in 2017
 - 3rd fastest growing in the 65+
- Baby Boomers
 - Born 1946 - 1964
 - 1,206,000 Boomers in Colorado (21% of pop. in 2018)
- 2018 - 2030 Colorado's population 65+ will grow 806,000 to 1,201,000 (49%) (**primarily from aging**)
- Transition age distribution from “young” to more US average between 2018 and 2030.




Projected Change in Specific Age Group Populations in Colorado, 2018 to 2025





 - All price levels and need levels, fewer movers.
- Income - Downward Pressure
- Health/Disabilities
- Transportation
- Public Finance - Downward Pressure
- Aging Plan - Make sure to have one.





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Median Home Value, ACS 2013-17












